Red is the colour of martyrdom, a symbol of victims of religious persecution. By hosting a balloon launch, you will show your solidarity. Fundraise by charging individuals to take part. (If you can, please do your bit for the planet by using bio-degradable balloons)

Write in Red Pen

Another way you can show your solidarity is in ink! Some schools have chosen to do an entire day of lessons in red ink. Red is a symbol of the victims of religious persecution, show your support for those who suffer because of their faith.
