SYRIA: LET ME LIVE MY CHILDHOOD



WHAT IS THE PROJECT?

This covers lots of projects which are aimed at helping children and young people who have lived through the war. One of these is: "Let Me Live My Childhood" in the city of Aleppo.

WHO WILL IT BENEFIT?

Syrian children who have witnessed the reality of war. This project helps them to have fun again and just 'be children'. It will help children like those of all faiths who in 2016 signed a petition asking other countries to support lasting peace in their country. Over a million children took part and created pictures showing their love for their country or their daily experience of life in war-torn Syria.

This project will start the healing process in some of those children.

Sick and orphaned children will also be helped. Their families will benefit from this too, and hope will be brought back to the region.

We ask the Lord to grant us peace and happiness, and to fill all our hearts, so that we can heal our wounds, and return to our normal life as soon as possible." SYRIAN YOUTH: Education

WHAT IS THE PROJECT?

The launch of a number of different educational aid programmes and scholarships to help children and young people in Syria.

WHY IS IT NEEDED?

This helps Christian families left in Syria. Many have lost their work and their homes and they cannot afford pay for their children to go to school.

This project gives hope to the Christians who have suffered during and after the war and will enable them to stay in their beloved Syria.

This programme helps 1215 school pupils 437 university students in Homs 105 university students in Damascus 300 especially needy families many sick and orphaned children.

LEBANON: ST JOHN The Merciful Table

WHAT IS THE PROJECT?

St John the Merciful Table is a Church-run meal service for Syrian refugees and other needy people in Lebanon.

WHY IS IT NEEDED?

Many Christian refugees from Syria (and others) do not even have one balanced meal a day. Even among the local people there are many needy people, especially among the elderly and those children whom nobody seems to be caring for.

This project provides over a thousand people will be given a hot meal each day. It also provides food brought by volunteers to the elderly and sick, who cannot get out of their homes.
This project gives people hope as it provides a place for people to meet and support each other. They can chat and help each other with the emotional pain they suffer because of the war.


