For 23 years Jeremiah tried to warn God's people to live good lives and not to ignore God's rules. They didn't listen. Enter Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon. This will not end well for the Israelites...

Have you ever heard of a calligram?

A calligram is a word or poem written in a shape that helps to explain its meaning. A poem about your new kitten shaped like a cat's head, for example, or one about speed shaped like a racing car.

Today's chapter is a poem about the joy of coming home about people who are just so happy that they are shouting and singing and dancing.

Below are the words of the first verse from today's chapter. On the next page we've included some shapes that might help you to come up with a good, joyful shape for your calligram. You can use one of these shapes or come up with your own—and you can write out the whole psalm or just part of it or maybe even write it out more than once.

Chapter 40:

In today's chapter the Jewish people are happy to return to their homeland, but they find that things have changed. They live under foreign rulers, but they work to preserve their heritage and their faith. They never lose hope that God will send help. When the Jewish people returned to Jerusalem, they began to study their faith more closely. They learned all they could about God and their ancestors and their faith grew very strong.

In this picture from the Child's Bible, we see a Jewish priest reading a text from a scroll. Scrolls were often used to write things down before books were

invented. A scroll is a long piece of paper with a stick at each end; the text is read by unrolling one side of the scroll while rolling up the other side. Genius, right?





Scrolls are easy to make and they are a really nice way to send a special message to someone.

All you need is:


A piece of paper

Two cotton buds (or short sticks of any kind)

Some tape







Cut out a strip of paper that is about the width of the middle section of your cotton buds (the part without any cotton attached); it can be as long as you want.

Place a cotton bud at each end and tape it down to the paper. We wrapped some foil around the ends of our cotton buds to add a bit of bling.

Now it's time to add your message! When you're done, roll up your scroll from both ends at the same time (this is tricky, so be patient!).

You can tie it shut with a piece of yarn or ribbon.

The edition in Spanish is the most popular (around 14 million copies printed), with Portuguese not far behind (10.3 million). English (2.5 million), French (1.2 million) and Swahili (950,000) are the next most popular languages.

From the very beginning, ACN has distributed *God Speaks to his Children* to struggling Christian communities free of charge. For every copy sold in the UK, 3 more copies will be sent out to children elsewhere for free.
