

Chapter 57:

This story has many great aspects, including showing us the love that the man's friends had for him, the trust that he had in them and the goodness & forgiveness that Jesus gives to all of us.

We thought that today's story would work great as a drama!

Activity - Curing of the paralysed man drama

Step 1: Try to tell the story again to someone with you or even to yourself. Think carefully and answer the following questions:

Who are the characters?

Where does the story take place?

What are the most important parts of the story (the ones you definitely have to include in your drama)?



Is this a one-person play or will you have multiple characters?

Step 2: Write out the Cast of Characters.

Step 3: Gather some props.

Step 4: Now you'll need to get writing! Try not to include too many lines, as they can be hard to remember sometimes and this can distract from the drama!

Step 5: When everything is ready, rehearse once or twice with your cast, props and costumes. If someone in your house can watch your play now, that's great! If not, save it for another time when you can play to a bigger audience!

Chapter 58:

In the other stories we have heard this week, Jesus is the one being called upon by people, but in this story, we hear that Jesus calls Levi to come and follow him. Because Levi was a tax collector, he had a bad reputation. Many people would have thought it strange that Jesus had chosen this man to speak with and share a meal with. But this is when we begin to see that Jesus is someone who seeks to find people whom others might consider 'outsiders'.

Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) does amazing work to support those people around the world who are considered 'outsiders'. In many countries, those who are Christians are treated differently because of these beliefs. It happens in many other religions too, but the greatest number of people who suffer are Christians. We would like to invite you to watch this short video > https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gWB8Ts8Z|3s&t=2s which tells the story of a young girl in the Middle East. She and her family have faced many difficulties and forced out of their home—because some people think they don't belong there as they are Christians.

After watching the video, taka a little bit of time to think about what YOU can do to be a welcoming person to those who feel like outsiders. This could be a new person at school, or maybe someone who doesn't have many friends. Then you can write your own short prayer—asking Jesus to help you to be kind and welcoming, just as he is.

Here is our prayer:

Lord, we ask that you give us the courage to be kind and welcoming to everyone we meet, especially those who have suffered people being cruel or unkind to them. Amen.



Prayer for today:

Lord, today we pray for those people who have been pushed out of their homes or communities, especially in the Middle East. Please be with them and show them how much you love them.

A large crowd had gathered to hear what Jesus had to say. The words that Jesus shared are very important for Christians. We can be comforted by the things that Jesus said, as they still apply to us here in the 21st century. When we struggle or when things are difficult, we can always remember that Jesus is with us through it all.

All those who know they are poor in the eyes of God can rejoice, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to them.

All those who are in sorrow can rejoice, for God will comfort them.

All those who do not resort to violence can rejoice, for God will give them possession of the earth.

All those who yearn that God's will be done can rejoice, for God will fulfil their longing.

All those who are merciful can rejoice, for God will have mercy on them.

All those who have a pure heart can rejoice, for they will see God.

All those who create peace can rejoice, for God will make them his children.

All those who are persecuted because they do God's will can rejoice, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to them.

On the left you can see those words that Jesus said—we call them 'The Beatitudes'.

Your task for today is to read through them carefully, or ask a grown up to read them to you/with you.

Choose one or two of the statements which you think are most important or mean the most to you.

Ask God to help you to follow that statement in your life! You could say or write out a prayer, create a painting or drawing, or investigate some more practical ways to help people in need.

There are lots of ways to communicate with God!

The ACN Child's Bible project introduces children in the UK to the little red book that has played such an important part in the lives of so many children around the world.



God Speaks to his Children, the ACN Child's Bible, is sometimes the only book a child will ever own. It has been used since its release in 1979 to teach children about their Christian faith and to provide an invaluable literacy tool as well!. To date, over 51 million copies in 190 languages have gone out around the world. The edition in Spanish is the most popular (around 14 million copies printed), with Portuguese not far behind (10.3 million). English (2.5 million), French (1.2 million) and Swahili (950,000) are the next most popular languages.

From the very beginning, ACN has distributed *God Speaks to his Children* to struggling Christian communities free of charge. For every copy sold in the UK, 3 more copies will be sent out to children elsewhere for free.
