Chapter 41:

In today's chapter we learn about Job. He had it all—a big family, successful businesses, a nice house and lots of friends. He was a good man with strong faith in God. Then God took it all away. <u>lt's not fair!</u>

When things don't go our way, we often think or say or even shout, "It's not fair!" Especially if we feel that we haven't done anything wrong, we can find it very hard to understand why we are missing out on good things. Let's use Job's story to help us find a way to deal with the anger or hurt feelings that we all experience at one time or another.

The opening lines tell us that Job was a very lucky guy.

⇒ Can you remember some of the wonderful things in Job's life? What are the extraspecial things in your life?





When God decides to test Job's faith, he takes away everything that Job loves one thing at a time.

⇒ What does Job lose when God puts him to the test? How do you think Job felt when he realised that everything that he'd loved was gone?

Job's friends came and sat with him for a whole week. They knew they couldn't say anything to make him feel better, but they stayed with him all the same.

⇒ Have you ever tried to help a friend or family member who was feeling sad? Have you ever needed a friend just to sit with you? How were you feeling? What did your friend do to help?

Eventually Job gets cross and he wants to know why God has made him suffer so much.

 \Rightarrow What does God say to Job? How does he explain what's happened?

Job realises that God's plan for him is so wonderful and so great and so important that he can't understand it. When bad things happen to Job—and to us—God is still there. He can be trusted to have a special plan for each of us.

⇒ Will Job's story help you remember that God has a special plan for you the next time you feel sad or angry about something that has happened to you?





Prayer for today: Lord, help us to be thankful for what we have—we know that you are with us through everything—when things are good and also when things are difficult.



Chapter 42:

In today's chapter God asks Jonah to do something that he really doesn't want to do. He runs away to sea, gets swallowed by a whale, convinces the people of Nineveh to behave better and learns an important life lesson. You can watch today's video here > https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lia-Qshc-TQ

Did you notice that today's chapter talks about some things that are REALLY BIG (like the ocean and the whale and the entire city of Nineveh and all the people who live there) and other things that are really small (like the tiny worm that chewed through the plant and poor little Jonah who thought he could hide from God)?

Jonah was much smaller than the whale, but would he have fit into its stomach like today's chapter tells us? We've done some research and it turns out that whales have THREE stomachs! It sounds like Jonah

spent some time in the very first stomach of his whale. This could have measured about 1 metre wide by 2.5 metres long. You can measure out this space in your house or your garden to see just what would fit inside...

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

Chapter 43:

In today's chapter we hear about Daniel's vision; there's snow and smoke and fire and thrones...and that's all before the Son of Man arrives! You can watch today's video here

Through Daniel's vision, God tells us about something very important that will happen before too long. The coming of the Son of Man (can you guess who that is?) wasn't something that Daniel could easily explain to people, so he sets out his vision as a picture—he describes all of the details for us.

Can you remember what he says about the 'One of great age'? What are the colours that come to mind? How do these colours—the colours of ice and snow and flames and fire make you feel?



Colours can cheer us up or calm us down. They can help us to celebrate and they can warn us of danger. Let's see how changing colours can change our feelings about a picture.

You'll need three pieces of paper (white if possible).

Using a pencil, make a simple outline drawing of anything you like—it could be some flowers, your school or even just a few shapes. You'll need to make two more copies of your drawing so you have one on each piece of paper. They won't be identical, but try to make all three as similar as you can.

Now here's the fun part!

Using crayons, coloured pencils or paints, colour in each of the drawings using different groups of colours.

For the first one, use only 'warm' colours—red, orange and yellow.

For the second, use only 'cool' colours: blue, green and purple.

For the third, use only white, black and grey.



Look at each drawing and think about how it makes you feel. Show the drawings to the others in your family. Which do they like best? Why?



Colours inspire us. What's your favourite colour?

It has been used since its release in 1979 to teach children about their Christian faith and to provide an invaluable literacy tool as well!. To date, over 51 million copies in 190 languages have gone out around the world. The edition in Spanish is the most popular (around 14 million copies printed), with Portuguese not far behind (10.3 million). English (2.5 million), French (1.2 million) and Swahili (950,000) are the next most popular languages.

From the very beginning, ACN has distributed *God Speaks to his Children* to struggling Christian communities free of charge. For every copy sold in the UK, 3 more copies will be sent out to children elsewhere for free.
