


Chapter 81:

In today's chapter we hear the story of the Last Supper—Jesus' final meal with his disciples. You can watch today's video here > https://www.youtube.com/watch? v=CsmQaPAwoAE

Jesus gave us a gift beyond our imagining at the Last Supper. During what was a Jewish Passover meal, Jesus made God's plan to stay with us always complete. He said:

"Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my body which will be given up for you."

From that day until today, every time a priest says those same words at Mass, Jesus is made present! He literally (in a way we can't know through our senses) makes us able to be with him just like the disciples at the Last Supper. God doesn't love us from a far off place; he allows us to be in his actual presence! The creator of the universe! When we go to Mass we partake of Jesus's suffering, death, resurrection and glory in heaven.



When you look at the crucifix, you understand how much Jesus loved you then. When you look at the Sacred Host, you understand how much Jesus loves you now.

(St Teresa of Calcutta)

This is the wonderful truth, my dear friends: the Word, which became flesh two thousand years ago, is present today in the Eucharist.



Think of a famous person you really admire and respect. A sportsperson, a blogger, YouTuber, a singer, actor or celebrity. Once you can picture the person, imagine they are coming to your house. What would it be like to have this person you look up to in your house?

Now imagine if, when they arrive, they ask if they can help you with your homework, tidy your room or help your parents clean the bathroom! Would you be shocked? What would you think? Why might you say, "No, you can't do that — we need to serve you"? If you can imagine that or the Queen or even Pope Francis coming to your house and cooking dinner and then doing all the washing up, then you have some idea of what Jesus did in this passage.

Except Jesus wasn't a famous person or a popular celebrity, Jesus is God!

God made man, the King of kings and the Lord of the universe.



In ancient Palestine, washing feet was a job that slaves did because it was really unpleasant. "People wore sandals or went barefoot, and the roads and paths that they walked were the same ones used by herdsmen to drive their animals to market, as well as travellers and traders who moved their goods by ox and camel."*

These roads would be dusty and would have animal dung on them, so feet and sandals would be pretty smelly.

What Jesus did was so unexpected and strange (for the Master to do the most lowly job) that we have to take notice and understand why he did it.

Jesus was teaching us to love. He showed us that love is about putting other people's needs before your own. For doing unselfish things and never thinking of yourself as too good to serve another person. For Jesus, it doesn't matter if you are famous, popular, rich, from a royal family – he teaches us that in God's eyes we are all the same and that if we want to be like him we need to roll our sleeves up and actually help the people around us.






This he said is following his example: Love one another!

You should love one another as I have loved you!

Once you have written them all you can make your paper chain. Hang your chain of love somewhere visible and each evening pray for all the people on the chain and all of those giving their lives to help others.





Prayer for today: Jesus, we pray for the courage to help others in need. Please help us to show love to everyone we meet.

In today's video Clare asked us to think about companionship. Jesus needed his companions on the Mount of Olives but they fell asleep. As we say our prayers today, let us thank God for all the companions he has given us. We can also forgive those who haven't been good friends to us or have let us down and pray for forgiveness for when we have let others down. In the box is a suggestion for a prayer you could offer with your family as well as discussion questions.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FAMILY PRAYER TIME

If you have a garden and it is a warm evening, go outside with your parents or carers after dark. Your parents (or older sibling) could bring a candle and you can sit around the candle and think about what Jesus went through that night (if you do not have a garden you could do this in a dimly lit room).

When you are outside think about Jesus.

That he was afraid of what was going to happen to him.

That he was sad that his disciples weren't there for him.

His upset that Judas, his follower and friend, was about to betray him.

Each person in the group may want to pray quietly for a few minutes or you could pray together/one at a time.

Some prayers you might want to share:

Jesus thank you for being my friend and companion.

Jesus thank you for giving me______ (name the people in your life who have been good companions).

Father thank you for loving me.

Forgive me for the times I have not been a good friend.



After you have prayed the above, you can spend a few minutes with Jesus. God is outside time, so when we pray, we are united with God in eternity. This means the time we spend can be as if we were there with Jesus on that night before his death. Thank him for his love and ask him to help you to know he is there when you are afraid or let down.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- Why do we think about what Jesus went through?
- What do you think he meant when he prayed, "Father, if you will, you can spare me this suffering and death. Nevertheless, not my will but yours be done."
- Why do you think his sweat fell like drops of blood to the earth?
- Why do you think Jesus healed the servant's ear?

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Chapter 84:



In the white menu bar, you can look at Key facts, a description and download the image. You can zoom in using the dial in the right-hand side of the screen.

ACTIVITY PART 1:

Before reading the description of the artwork, ask yourself the following questions:



- 1. What is the artist trying to tell us about Peter?
 - 2. Which part of the artwork are you drawn to?
- Look closely and describe the lines El Greco has used.
- 4. What can you learn about Peter from this image?
 - 5. Do any elements of the painting seem real?
- 6. What colours have been used? Are the colours important?
- 7. What was your first reaction to this artwork? Why do you think you had the reaction?
 - 8. Do you like the painting?
 - 9. Which area of the artwork is most important? Why?
 - 10. How does your eye move through the artwork? What choices did the artist make to make that happen?



Describe the artwork in three words.







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ACTIVITY PART 2:

Create your own version of this picture of Peter denying Jesus. Add speech bubbles in one colour and thought bubbles in another. You can read the passage in Luke 22: 54-62 or listen to the reading again. Some examples are shown to help you.





Prayer for today: We are sorry Jesus, for the times we say we don't know you. Maybe we are embarrassed to have faith, or scared of what people might say. Help us today to have courage.





Chapter 85: In today's chapter we hear about how Jesus had to defend himself in front of many people, who wanted to hurt him. You can watch today's video here > https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=klQCyT7gCHY

In this passage the chief priests say that they need no more witnesses against Jesus (the law required two witnesses). It is interesting for us to pause and think about the word witness because we usually see it as a good thing; that we witness to God's love. A witness is a person who can give evidence based on knowledge of a fact, event, or experience. For Christians we witness to God's existence in everything we do, say and are.



ACTIVITY:

This game is a bit like musical statues and a bit like scrabble!

You will need:

- At least 26 pieces of scrap paper (one for each letter of the alphabet)
- Marker pens
- Music
- A large space: e.g. the floor of a room or outside if it is not windy!
- Someone to pause the music and be the umpire
- At least one other person to play with








Preparation:

- 1. Write one letter of the alphabet on each piece of paper. (You can duplicate letters if you have more than 26 pieces of paper.)
- 2. Lay them out on the floor face up.
- 3. Get ready to play.





The aim of the game is to get as many letters (pieces of paper with letters from the alphabet on), by saying sentences about witnessing to being a Catholic and following Jesus.

- 1. Start the music. When the music is playing you need to dance around the room being careful not to land on one of the letters.
- 2. When the music stops, jump on the nearest letter to you.
- 3. Use that letter to find a word to say a sentence about being a witness to Jesus. For example, if you landed on the letter 'P' you would say: "I can witness to Jesus by helping the poor." If the umpire thinks your sentence is correct/makes sense/explains being a witness, you keep that letter to the side.
- 4. If you can't think of something beginning with that letter then you leave the letter where it is.
- 5. Carry on playing until all the letters have been lifted.
- 6. Count how many letters you have. The person with the most letters wins.









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Tips:

- 1. If you are playing with lots of people, then do more than one set of letters.
- 2. You might want to include blank pieces of paper for free 'any letter' answers (like playing the joker).



Advanced version

One you have said your statement, e.g. "I can witness to Jesus by helping the poor", if you can say then whether that would be with your hands, heart or words, and give an example, the umpire may decide to give you an extra point. This is shown by writing (or drawing) a hand, heart or word on the letter. At the end, the pieces of paper with these visible extra markings are worth two points.



Prayer for today: Dear Jesus, today we pray for the opportunities to help others. Open our eyes to suffering that is happening in our own communities and also further afield in places around the world.
