





Chapter 66:

Today's chapter follows on from the feeding of the 5,000. Jesus tells the people that it is not only food we need to fill our tummies, but we need spiritual food too! You can watch today's video here > https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3JYi-sKw6e0

In today's video reflection, Bishop Stephen invites us to think about First Holy Communion. Perhaps you have already made yours, you might be waiting to do it, you might still have a few years to wait, or maybe you're not sure if you will make your First Holy Communion. Wherever you may be in your faith and in life, there are special things you can take away from this chapter.

This chapter and Bishop Stephen's reflection made us think about a song called 'Céad Míle Fáilte Romhat'. It is a traditional Irish song, and is usually played or sung at the celebration of First Communion. You may be thinking what is that language?! It is GAELIC, the traditional Irish language.

There are lots of videos online where you can listen to the song being sung, as it can be hard for us to imagine what these words might sound like! But the song really just means 'A thousand welcomes, Jesus'.

Your task for today is simply to think about those words 'Welcome Jesus'. What can we do today to welcome Jesus into our lives? There is no right or wrong answer—everyone will have different thoughts. For us, we want to make the effort to have some quiet time in order to have time to think, pray and talk to Jesus.



Prayer for today: Lord, today we pray for all those who do not feel welcome—especially those who are not welcome in their own country. We pray also for all people who don't get to receive Holy Communion because of difficult situations where they live.





Chapter 67: In today's chapter we hear about a conversation between Jesus and His Disciples. He asks them to share who they think he is, and shares some of what the future holds for him. You can watch today's video here > https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eK5QjbXqINY

In this chapter, we hear Jesus sharing about how many people have lots of different names for him. He asks his disciples, 'Who do you say I am?'. Peter gives the answer, 'We believe that you are the Messiah, the Redeemer whom God has promised.'

We know that there are many names for Jesus—but this is what we need to remember: Jesus is our friend, the one who is there to save us when things go wrong and to bring peace to our world. Your task for today is to make a newspaper front page, proclaiming this great news!

There is an example below, but feel free to make it however you may like!





Prayer for today: Jesus, we pray today for help when we might be afraid to say that you are our friend. Sometimes people might tease us for believing in you—we pray for courage today.





Chapter 68: In today's chapter we hear the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. You can watch today's video here > https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=2fBNNPaTGfo

That long word, transfiguration, means to change either in appearance or a spiritual way. In this story, we hear that Jesus changes in both of these ways, and it helps his disciples to understand more about God's plan for Jesus' life on earth.

In today's video Susanne did a great job of showing us through her drawing, all the things going on in the story!



Today's story is a busy one! Your task for today is to create a drawing showing all the different elements of the story. Things to feature in your picture might be: Jesus, Peter, James, John, the mountain, Elijah, Moses, the clouds and God's message.

You can create your picture in any style you like—you can use colouring pencils, felt tips, crayons, pencil or paint—whatever you might have around at home.



Prayer for today: Lord, today we pray that we always accept your invitation. Help us to see when you are reaching out to us, and help us to call on you when we are afraid or worried.







We're sure that many of you will have heard this story before. Jesus' parables help us to understand important issues better. One thing to remember from today's chapter is that Jesus is asking us always to be willing to help others—even if we don't really want to.

Your task today is to think about what you can do to help the people around you, using your helping hands!

You will need:


Blank piece of paper & some felt tips or colouring pencils—that's it!



Step 1: Trace around your hands to create an outline using your pen or pencil.

Step 2: Start by writing 'These hands are for helping' across the top of your page. Write your name in one of the hands, and in the other one write something which you are going to do to help the people around you.

And it's as simple as that!





Prayer for today: Lord, we pray for the courage to stand up for what is right in our world. Please give us the courage to always use our helping hands for good, and help us to look past differences we may have with people around us.

Similarly to yesterday's chapter, we receive an invitation today from Jesus to reach out and help other people. Jesus gives us some practical ways to look out for people. These actions might sound familiar to you—they have a special name...the *Corporal Works of Mercy*.

Feed the hungry
Give drink to the thirsty
Shelter the homeless
Clothe the naked
Visit the sick &
imprisoned
Bury the dead
Give alms to the poor

Some of these actions may sound quite strange. You may not be able to help with all of these things, but today we'd like you to look at these acts of mercy and choose one or two that you think you can do. You can be creative with your acts of mercy—there are lots of small things that we can do to help others. You could donate to a charity, buy some extra food in the weekly shop for the food bank or call an elderly relative or friend who might be feeling lonely. Let us know what you decide to do!



Prayer for today: We pray today for all those people in the world who need help. Whether they are sick, in poverty, lonely, hungry—whatever it may be. We pray that all people will open their eyes to the suffering going on around them.





The ACN Child's Bible project introduces children in the UK to the little red book that has played such an important part in the lives of so many children around the world.



God Speaks to his Children, the ACN Child's Bible, is sometimes the only book a child will ever own. It has been used since its release in 1979 to teach children about their Christian faith and to provide an invaluable literacy tool as well!. To date, over 51 million copies in 190 languages have gone out around the world. The edition in Spanish is the most popular (around 14 million copies printed), with Portuguese not far behind (10.3 million). English (2.5 million), French (1.2 million) and Swahili (950,000) are the next most popular languages.

From the very beginning, ACN has distributed *God Speaks to his Children* to struggling Christian communities free of charge. For every copy sold in the UK, 3 more copies will be sent out to children elsewhere for free.
