


Stations of the Cross for the Suffering Church

Introduction: THE WAY OF THE CROSS


Every day millions of Christians around the world suffer for their faith. Many are persecuted for their beliefs; they can suffer from discrimination at home or in the workplace, fines, imprisonment, torture and even execution. Still others are living out their Christian faith in extremely isolated communities or in the face of abject poverty.

Every story about suffering and persecuted Christians involves real people with names and hopes and dreams, and it is often far too easy for us to think in terms of facts. figures and statistics rather than those who are suffering. St Paul the Apostle reminds us that, "just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptised into one body... If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together." (1 Cor 12: 12-13, 26) St Paul underlines our responsibility towards our brothers and sisters. So let us work together to end their suffering and persecution by offering our prayers, sharing their stories with others and, finally, through our actions.



Just as we walk with Jesus whenever we pray before the Stations of the Cross, so we walk with all those who suffer for their faith. Let us pray for them, that their faith may continue to grow and that their suffering will ease through the mercy and compassion of Our Lord.

Indonesia

At 10.26am on 28th March 2021, Palm Sunday, two suspected suicide bombers attacked the Sacred Heart of Jesus Cathedral in Makassar, the capital of Indonesia's South Sulawesi province. The attack took place at the side gate to the Cathedral and the explosion killed both bombers, who were apparently a newlywed couple. At least 20 people were injured. The two suspected suicide bombers were linked to the Jamaah Ansharut Daulah (JAD) network, which is affiliated with Daesh (ISIS). JAD has been blamed for several attacks in Indonesia, including church bombings. The Indonesian bishops' conference Commission for Ecumenical and Interreligious affairs issued a statement just after the bombing asking for prayers and stating, "We hope that the incident will not harm or weaken the relationships which have so far been intensively built, maintained, and developed by religious followers. May the Lord continue to give peace and protection to all of us." <u>ACN News, March 29 2021</u>

Nigeria

Leah Sharibu, a young Nigerian, turned 18 on 14th May 2021, 1,153 days after she was forcibly taken from her school along with 110 classmates in February 2018. The following March, those students who were still alive were returned by the extremists, but Leah was held back for refusing to convert to Islam as the price of her freedom. To mark the third anniversary of her abduction in February 2021, ACN spoke with Evangelical pastor and friend of the Sharibu family, Gideon Para-Mallam. Rev Para-Mallam called on the world's governments to apply pressure on President Muhammadu Buhari's administration to step up its efforts to release all those held by Boko Haram/ ISWAP. Alice Ngaddah, a young Christian nurse and mother of two, was kidnapped just ten days after Leah; she too remains in custody. Confirmation that both Leah and Alice are still alive was received by ACN in October 2021. ACN News, May 14 2021 ACN News, October 7 2021

Myanmar/Burma

Cardinal Charles Maung Bo, Archbishop of Yangon (Rangoon), condemned attack on the Sacred Heart Church, Kayanthayar, south-east Burma (Myanmar) in May 2021. According to reports, more than 300 people sought refuge in the church after soldiers attacked the village looking for members of groups opposed to February's military coup. The cardinal said: "The church suffered extensive damage, bearing witness to the intensity of attack on a place of worship." The Sacred Heart Cathedral in Pekhon in neighbouring Shan State, was also damaged by artillery shells the previous day (Pentecost Sunday, 23rd May). Cardinal Bo expressed great concern for all those who left Kayanthayar to escape the fighting. <u>ACN News, May 27 2021</u>



Nepal

Two Korean missionaries from the Congregation of Sisters of St Paul of Charters were arrested in Nepal after a complaint accusing the Sisters of proselytism and conversion activities. Together Sr Martha and Sr Gemma run a training and social services centre for slum children in the Pokhara area. Bishop Paul Simick, Vicar Apostolic of Nepal, says "We believe that the allegations of conversions are utterly baseless and unjust." In recent years, Christian Churches generally have been experiencing growing hostility and intolerance in Nepal following the adoption of the new Constitution in 2015 and the new penal code that outlawed proselytism and efforts to convert others. 

Venezuela

For more than 15 years, the people of Venezuela have been suffering a terrible economic crisis. Nearly seven million Venezuelans have emigrated to escape the crisis, including many young people. Venezuela suffers from uncontrolled hyperinflation. Hyperinflation affects the poorest especially, who see their low incomes increasingly lose value; meanwhile, hunger increases and employment and business opportunities decrease. Salesian, Bishop Raul Biord of La Guaira, a diocese in the north-central part of the country, said the Church is committed to helping those most in need through different food programmes for destitute children and the elderly. There are also many soup kitchens in parishes, dispensaries and parish health centres, where thousands of volunteers are helping the most vulnerable every day. <u>ACN International news report, October 25 2021</u>

Pakistan

A young Christian woman in Pakistan, Neelam Majid Masih, 30, is determined to let "the world…know what happened to me." Neelam was attacked in her home where she was sexually assaulted and beaten after refusing to convert to Islam and marry Faisal Basra, a man in his late 20s. Mr Basra pleaded guilty after being charged with rape and faces ten years in prison. On the evening of the attack, Mr Basra tried to kill Neelam, but Neelam's neighbour and cousin, Nasir Masih heard her cries and rushed round; Mr Basra fled. Neelam's lawyer, Sumera Shafique, says her decision to go public is "very unusual" as most victims are cowed into silence. There have been reports that friends and family of Faisal Basra, are trying to kill Neelam for standing up to him. Neelam, who is in hiding, is studying for a Master's degree. As the only educated Christian woman in her village, she is committed to speaking out against oppression and abuse. The Movement for Solidarity and Peace in Pakistan calculates that every year up to 1,000 young Christian and Hindu women and girls aged between 12 and 25 are abducted by Muslim men. <u>ACN News, June 7 2021</u>



India

In January 2021 the Madhya Pradesh government implemented a stringent anti-conversion law. Christians in the central Indian state of Madhya Pradesh are living in fear after radical Hindutva activists stepped up a campaign to reconvert indigenous believers. More than a dozen Christians, including priests, were jailed and prayer meetings were obstructed following the allegation of religious conversion—a charge anybody can level without any proof. Between January and November 2021, Hindutva activists accused now fewer than 56 Christian leaders of carrying out illegal religious conversions. Father Rocky Shah, public relations officer of Jhabua Diocese, said: "Our people are frightened as radical Hindu groups are pressurising the indigenous Christians to give up their faith in Christianity." In Jhabua District, where indigenous people make up the majority, Christians comprise four percent of the population – but are less than one percent of the state's population of 71 million. Father Shah said Christians are contemplating taking legal action if harassment and persecution from radical Hindu groups continues. <u>ACN News, November 1 2021</u>



Armenia

In September 2020, the conflict between Armenia and Azerbaijan escalated into war in the disputed territory of Nagorno-Karabakh. Though a ceasefire was negotiated six weeks later, more than 4,000 Armenian soldiers were killed and over 90,000 ethnic Armenians were forced to flee their homes. Many have been unable to return and are now desperately trying to provide even the most basic necessities to their families. Lida (pictured above) saw her two sons head off to fight in the conflict. She, a widow, was forced to flee her home in Nagorno-Karabakh, and now lives in a dilapidated flat with her daughter-in-law and young grandchild in a village in Armenia. Both of her sons have returned home. One son is too traumatised to work ; the other has found a job, but will not be paid for six months. Little help for Lida or the thousands others like her is forthcoming from the state. ACN is supporting the local Catholic Church in its efforts to provide basic necessities and trauma counselling for 150 families in the nearby city of Goris. <u>ACN International News 22 Dec 2021</u>



Mali

According to reports, jihadists in central Mali are escalating offensives in an effort to take control of the region and impose Shari'a law. A local source has told ACN that Katiba Macina, an Islamist group with links to Al Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb, has burnt rice fields and attacked farmers harvesting their crops. They do this in order to intimidate the local community into joining their group or abandoning their land, so the Islamist extremists can take it over. In Ségou region, fierce fighting has broken out as local community militia and Donso hunters try to repel Katiba Macina. The conflict is complicated by armed bandits in the region trying to exploit the situation. ACN's source said, "There are villages where it is impossible [for people] to go and celebrate Holy Mass" because of the fear of being the target of verbal abuse or receiving anonymous threatening telephone calls. According to UN figures, the number of Internally Displaced People (IDPs) in the region exceeded more than 400,000 by the end of September 2021. With support from ACN, the Catholic Church in Mali is providing food and medical aid to IDPs and vulnerable families in the Ségou region regardless of their religion or ethnicity. <u>ACN News, December 3 2021</u>

Mozambique

A Sister in Mozambique held captive by jihadists for more than three weeks has raised the alarm about the growing numbers of children abducted by terrorists in Cabo Delgado Province of Mozambique. Sister Eliane da Costa, of the Congregation of Saint Joseph of Chambéry, was kidnapped with Sister Ines Ramos last August when the northern town of Mocimboa de Praia fell into terrorist hands. Father Kriwiwi Fonseca, a priest ministering to families displaced by Islamist violence, explained that the terrorists forcibly train the young boys to fight in their ranks and turn the girls into child brides. Father Fonseca said: "I believe the object is radicalisation. We are talking of children and young people who were torn from their homes last year, or the year before….lt's a long time to be in contact with evil, and one ends up assimilating this evil." Last March, ACN agreed emergency aid of around £140,000 to provide beans, flour, cooking oil and other foodstuffs for displaced people facing famine in Mozambique. <u>ACN News, June 10 2021</u>



Lebanon and Syria

Returning from a 10-day visit to Syria and neighbouring Lebanon, ACN's Regina Lynch said, "An associate [in Syria] of one of our project partners showed me pictures on her phone, which she took from her flat. You can see a little girl inside a large rubbish bin, rummaging, passing things to her mother." Internally displaced Syrians and over a million Syrian refugees in Lebanon are struggling to survive with as many as 90 percent now living below the poverty line. Economic collapse and hyperinflation in both countries mean that jobs are hard to find and food, housing and other necessities beyond the grasp of even those who were relatively well off before a decade of armed conflict in Syria. The vast numbers of Syrians streaming into Lebanon, the explosion in Beirut in August 2020 and the collapse of Lebanon's formerly healthy economy make it increasingly difficult for displaced Christians and others to find help and support in either country. ACN has funded more than 100 projects worth £426 million in Lebanon and Syria in 2021. <u>ACN News, October 5 2021</u>



Burkina Faso

In late October 2021, a group of 147 Christians – including children, elderly and eight pregnant women – fled from two villages on the Niger border, to Dori, the capital of Burkina Faso's Sahel region, as extremists sought to kill them. Still other Christians from the area were unable to flee. Multiple local sources have told ACN that terrorists entered villages and demanded taxes per head of cattle, as well as asking cattle herders whether they are Christian or Muslim so that they could kill the Christians. Laurent Birfuoré Dabiré, the Bishop of Dori and the president of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of Burkina Faso and Niger, told ACN that these sort of attacks, along with abductions and murders are taking place throughout the whole country. He said, "Dori runs the risk of being cut off from the rest of the country". In 2019 the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs estimated that 289,000 people had fled their homes because of the violence. In the last five years, ACN has funded 28 projects in the diocese of Dori, including emergency relief programmes and pastoral work. ACN News, November 5 2021



Holy Land

A recent statement by the bishops in Jerusalem explained that "[s]ince 2012 there have been countless incidents of physical and verbal assaults against priests and other clergy, attacks on Christian churches, with holy sites regularly vandalised and desecrated, and ongoing intimidation of local Christians who simply seek to worship freely and go about their daily lives. These tactics are being used by such radical groups in a systematic attempt to drive the Christian community out of Jerusalem and other parts of the Holy Land." The hierarchs noted that "radical groups continue to acquire strategic property in the Christian Quarter, with the aim of diminishing the Christian presence, often using underhanded dealings and intimidation tactics to evict residents from their homes..."The statement acknowledged with gratitude the Israeli government's express commitment to provide a secure home for Christians in the country, but expressed anxiety over the failure of state institutions to tackle these attacks. The local bishops have proposed the creation of protected zone within the Christian Quarter of Jerusalem's Old City to ensure the preservation of the city's Christian heritage. Chile

During the protests of 18th October 2020, the Church of the Assumption in the Chilean capital of Santiago was vandalised and set on fire. The inside was completely gutted. It is likely the reconstruction of the interior will take years, since under Chilean law the building is listed. Nonetheless, with financial help from ACN, one of the parish rooms has been reconfigured so that the Catholic faithful can gather to celebrate the Eucharist. ACN is currently working on a project to refurbish some of the parish offices also. Deeply affected by images of the church tower collapsing in a sea of flames, a group of university students, studying construction, electrical installation, restoration of historic buildings and risk prevention, contacted the parish priest to offer their help. Students, academics and volunteers launched the project "Sursum Corde" (Lift up your hearts) with the aim of assessing the damage and cleaning sculptures and paintings with a view to their future restoration. Since October 2019, no fewer than sixty Christian churches and chapels have been vandalised in Chile. <u>ACN International News September 7, 2021</u>



Haiti

The small island nation of Haiti is one of the poorest in the world. Natural disasters, political instability, inadequate infrastructure and a burgeoning gang culture add to the challenges faced by Haitians every day. In July, President Jovenel Moïse was assassinated in the presidential residence; little over a month later, Haiti was devastated by mudslides and flash flooding from a tropical storm landing just days after an earthquake wreaked havoc on the island. Haiti's Civil Protection Agency claims that 2,207 people lost their lives and 12,268 people were injured, while 53,000 homes were damaged or destroyed. 26 churches, including the Cathedral of St Louis, were extensively damaged, with at least 11 of these having collapsed completely. Shortly afterwards, Cardinal Chibly Langlois, Bishop of Les Cayes Diocese, described the dreadful situation, "The people are sleeping on the ground. There is no water, no electricity, no food, [and] no clothes." The cardinal explained that many people were traumatised by their experiences and were forced to wait to locate family members classified as missing. Working alongside the local Church and religious orders on the ground, ACN quickly arranged for the first portion of emergency aid to go out to Haiti to help 45 desperately struggling families in the Diocese of Jérémie. With the prayers and support of loyal benefactors around the world, ACN is working to rebuild churches, parishes and communities, offering hope and a brighter future to those who currently suffering in Haiti. 
