We hope that you and your students have enjoyed hearing the story of the Night Journey, and meeting the wonderful characters.

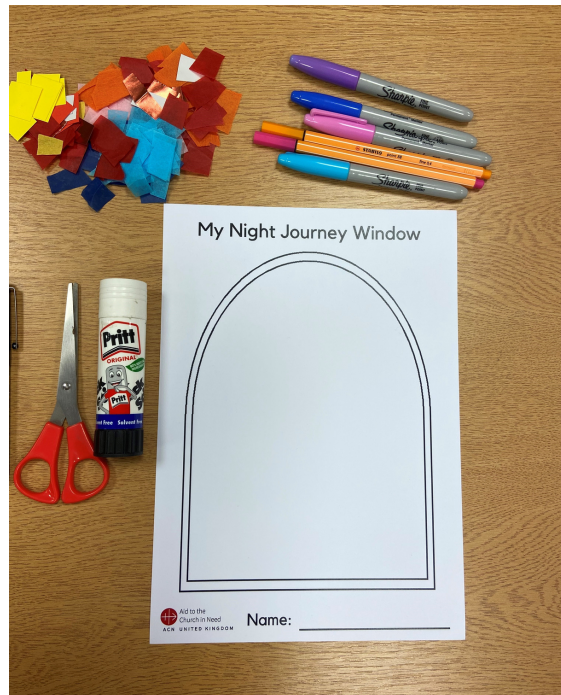
A couple of questions for you to reflect on before we start the crafting!

- What was your favourite part of the story?
- Have you ever seen a stained glass window? What do you remember about it?
- What do you think you would do if an angel invited you on a journey?
- The children ask Mary and Joseph what they think Jesus would like them to do. Let's say a prayer together to ask Jesus to inspire us this Advent.

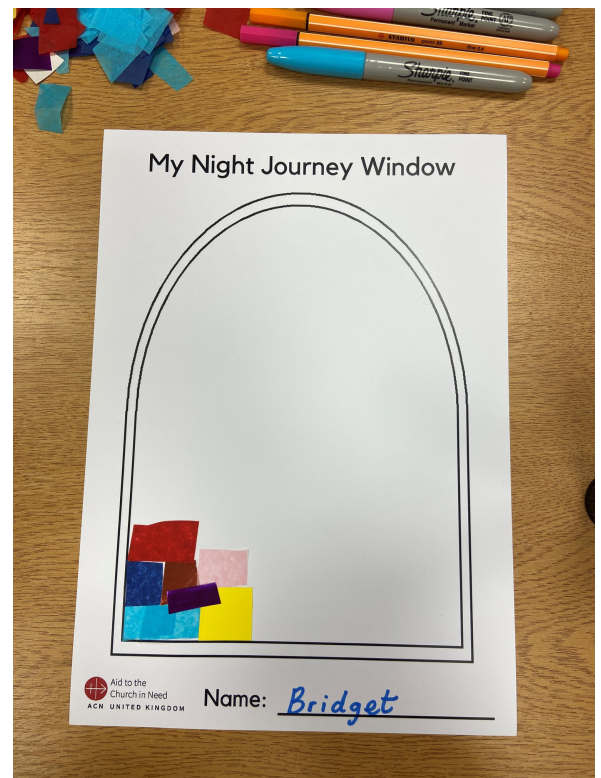

A big part of the story is the beautiful stained glass window at the church that Sapphire and Arlo go to on Christmas Eve. You are invited to make your very own stained glass window! There is a worksheet template attached that you can use. You can draw a design and colour it in or you could use paper/tissue paper to make a mosaic design. To do this method you will need:

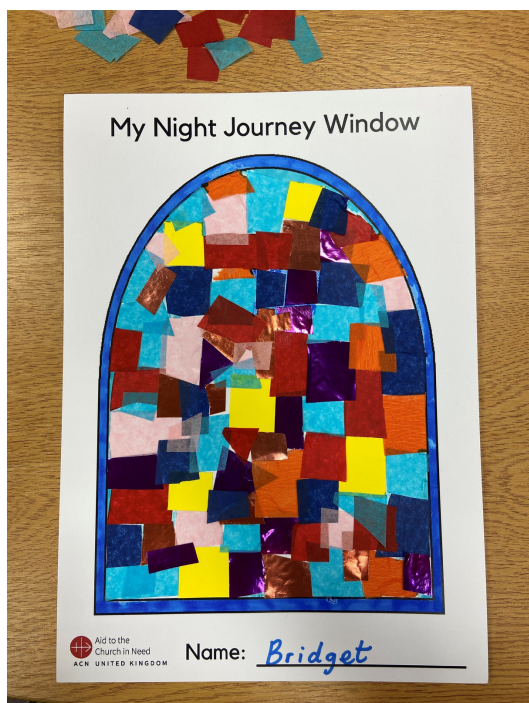
1. You will need the worksheet, glue stick, scissors (always use under adult supervision), pen/pencils/felt tips, and some small pieces of coloured paper.



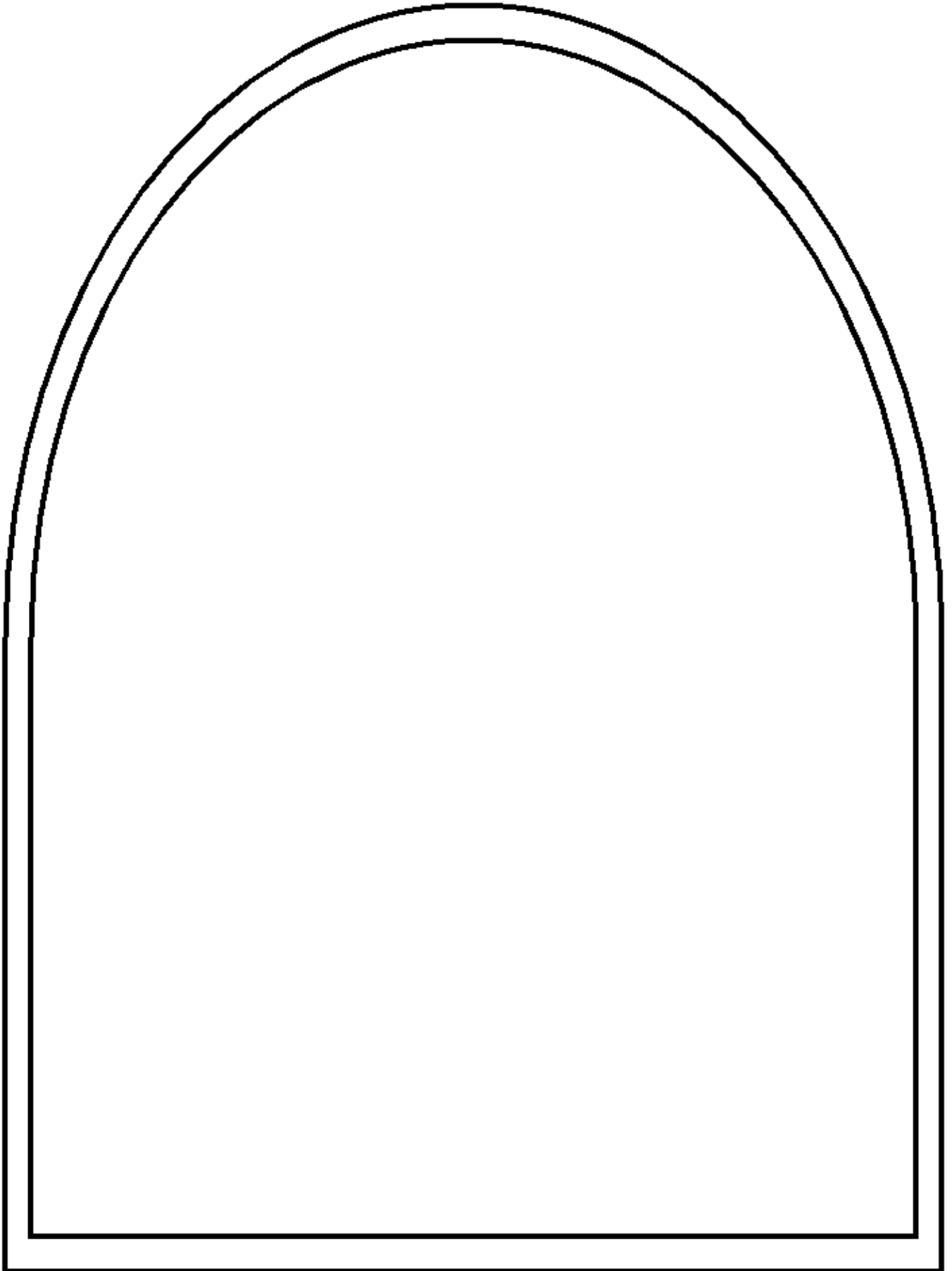
2. Using your glue stick, stick down the small pieces of paper. You can do a specific pattern, or just randomly, whatever you like!



3. The final result!
