When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd:

"Therefore, let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

Case Studies

THE AMAZON – RECRUITING PRIESTS



Spanning 53,000 square miles, the Diocese of Humaitá has about 85,000 Catholics in a total population of 125,000.

There are 21 priests in the diocese, but many of the Catholics only receive visits three to four times a year, as they live in remote settlements, often on the banks of the great rivers and accessible only by boat.

Consequently, the Catholic Church is hoping to expand its presence and its evangelization work, but this is only possible with the addition of more priests. So, the Diocese of Humaitá is trying to encourage more men to listen to the voice of God and become priests.

The project is starting to bear good fruit. There are six young men now studying at the archdiocesan seminary in Porto Velho. But funding their theological training is difficult, as their home diocese must pay for their study and lodging, and this is a heavy financial burden for an impoverished region. Aid to the Church in Need is helping to provide funding for this important mission, so that people in the Amazon can literally be baptised and supported as Catholics.



GHANA: BAKING EUCHARISTIC HOSTS



The Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus are a congregation of women religious, who work in healthcare and education, caring for the poor and disadvantaged, especially women and girls.

To help this congregation cover their costs, the Sisters make eucharistic hosts for several of the dioceses in the country. This provides a vital service to the Church, since without hosts, there is no Eucharist.

The number of Catholics is growing and many attend Holy Mass during the week as well. This adds up to a monthly demand for 1.5 million small hosts for the laity and 15,000 larger hosts for the priests.

AID TO THE CHURCH IN NEED

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With their 25-year-old and frequently malfunctioning machine, the Sisters could not manage to supply more than 15% of this demand, since the whole process of mixing the dough, cutting and baking the hosts was a long and painstaking one. It could also be quite dangerous, since the worn and damaged electrical cables posed a constant danger of electrical shock.

The Sisters turned to ACN for help, and we provided £20,000 for modern machinery, so that the Sisters can now considerably increase their production.



UKRAINE: BUILDING HOUSES

Capuchin Fathers run thriving parishes throughout Ukraine. In addition to celebrating Mass, they also offer many other spiritual opportunities for believers and seekers alike. They are available to anyone who wishes to talk with someone about faith, their personal lives, their questions, and concerns; and in this current time of war and crisis, the need for counselling has greatly grown. Although Lviv is scarcely touched by actual fighting, countless refugees have come here from other parts of the country, needing shelter as well as spiritual support and counsel.

In September 2021, three more Capuchin Fathers came to Lviv. They are planning to offer catechetical sessions for adults and prayer groups. But their most important mission is the confessional. In the cathedral, there are opportunities for confession at all times of day, and the Capuchin Fathers are regularly available to offer the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

There used to be two Capuchin monasteries in Lviv, but these buildings were confiscated by the communists and are still being used for other purposes today.

Their return seems almost impossible. The three Capuchin Fathers now live in a cramped, two-room apartment. They set up a tiny 'chapel' in a storeroom, and the kitchen doubles as the living room. The small quarters leave nowhere for them to gather with the faithful, meaning that prayer meetings, talks, and Eucharistic adoration mostly take place in private homes or apartments, or even in inns and public houses. In the summertime, the friars can often be found in the parks or on the streets of Ukraine, making music, talking to people about God and



offering them comfort. The Fathers clearly need a suitable space for their pastoral activities, and so they have turned to ACN for help. A property that requires renovation is now for sale. We are planning to help them with a contribution of £39,500, so that they can soon have a house that is better suited to their pastoral needs.
