

In early August 2014 more than 100.000 Christians in Iraq were forced to flee their homes on the Niniveh Plains before the advancing troops of Daesh (ISIS). Among them were the Dominican Sisters of Saint Catherine of Siena. Their convent in Batnaya was almost totally destroyed by the invading rebels. 
