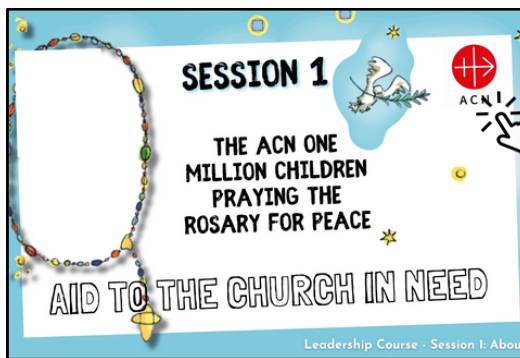
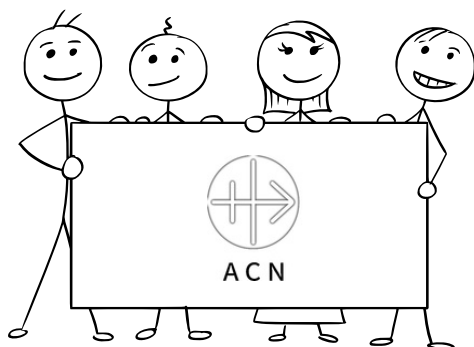
3 YOUR RESPONSE AND JOURNEY OF FAITH

SESSION STRUCTURE

1. Explain that they will be leading children in praying the rosary for peace on or sometime near 18th October.

PLAY SLIDE 2 ON PRESENTATION

2. Explain that in order to do this effectively, they will need to have some knowledge of:

- Aid to the Church in Need (ACN)
- The rosary
- What happened in Fatima in 1917
- The campaign One Million Children Praying the Rosary

This is what this course offers.

3. Invite participants to keep a prayer journal. Ask them to write their thoughts, prayers and feelings down, when they can, for the duration of the course.

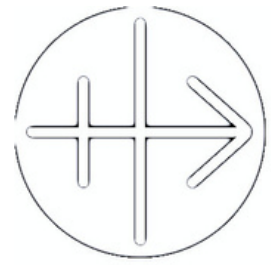
4. Ask students to look at the questions about ACN on the sheet and fill in any they already know (member groups who are very familiar with ACN may not need to do this stage).

SESSION 2

THE ACN ONE MILLION CHILDREN PRAYING THE ROSARY FOR PEACE



The rosary transforms those who pray it. It can be prayed by everyone - and its depths can't be fully explained.

Each of us has an individual relationship with God and also with Our Lady, so the way in which the rosary impacts each person is also individual.

The sheet 'Deep Truths about the Rosary' is for you to look at and ponder in your own time. Don't worry if you can't grasp everything contained within it - you certainly are not expected to (!) - but it should provide you with some theological truths which you may not have previously considered. You might want to use this as a start for prayer, come back to it, or research some of the statements independently.

DEEP TRUTHS ABOUT THE ROSARY

WHY THE ROSARY?
Is the rosary a nice prayer, we say to make ourselves feel better? Is it something that brings us peace in our hearts a bit like mindfulness?
No.

BELIEF ITSELF
Now it might make us feel better and bring us peace, but these aren't the foremost reasons we pray it. In order to understand the rosary, we need to look up a bit and understand belief itself.

COMMUNICATION WITH GOD
When we pray, we communicate with God. God - yes, the one who created the universe and holds our existence in his hands. The one who made the love of always that brought forth everything from a mistake to crazy-looking fish (just Google a Frog Fish & early development), to the colour of your hair. The one who knows your name calls you into a relationship with him for ever.

SPIRITUAL REALITY
God gives us ways in which we might not comprehend him. One of these ways is prayer. When we pray something changes because we are in God's presence. We might not feel it - in danger that what we feel, it's about spiritual reality.

EPHESIANS 6:12
There isn't a person on the planet who could cope that evil doesn't exist, and if there were, two seconds watching the news would change their mind in Ephesians 6:12 Of Paul says: "For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms."

FREE WILL
Basically, God wants us on his evil-conquering team now and eternally and one fundamental way we do this is through prayer.
So his prayer is nice and really made us feel better, but to say it's just this is missing the most point. Though prayer can bring the love Kingdom and will into our reality. Of course God could do this without prayer, but because of free will, he gives us a choice.

RELATIONSHIP
Prayer is a decision - I am going to spend this time with God no matter what I might feel, no peace and no sense of God's love or I might feel absolutely nothing, in fact I might be bored or distracted. This is the key to a good relationship with God (and heaven)! I may need to carry on even if I don't feel like it. This is worth staying when discussing the rosary, as it is a reasonably long prayer - 33 minutes minimum.

BIBLICAL
The rosary is a special prayer because it's biblical, it's simultaneously a meditation and a vocal prayer, it was given by God, and it has spiritual power.

MEDITATION
When we pray using the rosary, we enter into a prayer of meditation. We use our senses to bring ourselves with God's word. God's word is so powerful it creates. In the rosary we meditate on real events in the life Jesus and the Early Church. Meditation opens our deepest self (often below the level of consciousness) to God and on God's Word is living, it enters our entire self.

SPIRITUAL POWER
It is not a prayer to Mary as she is not God. We are asking her to give our prayers to her son, Jesus himself, he must and so do we. As he requested he intervened at the Wedding Feast at Cana. This is a model of prayer - Mary is our mother too.

FIGHTING EVIL
Rosary is often referred to as a spiritual sword. This is a metaphorical description which emphasizes its power in fighting evil. The term "spiritual sword" suggests that the rosary is a weapon against evil and a tool for spiritual defence.

PRAYER CAN BE HARD
It can be hard to pray the rosary, for your physical brain, when something is good, requires something good to accept it and get on with it. But when it comes to spiritual things we need to forget that the health of our souls, against evil and on long great everything else.

ESSENTIAL VOCABULARY

DECADE

Originates from the mid-15th century, initially meaning "ten parts" of anything. According to www.etymonline.com, "[t]he term comes from the Old French "décade" (14th century), which in turn derives from the Late Latin "decadem"...and...from the Greek "dekas", meaning "group of ten." When referring to the rosary, it means the ten Hail Marys prayed for each of the mysteries. HOW MANY OTHER WORDS DO YOU KNOW BEGINNING WITH 'DEC'? WHAT DO THEY MEAN?

MYSTERIES (OF THE ROSARY)

The Mysteries of the Rosary are not like mysteries in terms of whodunits or things that have no explanation. There are twenty mysteries of the rosary, divided into four categories of five. The first three sets of five (the Sorrowful Mysteries, the Joyful Mysteries, The Glorious Mysteries) are like a chronological walk through the lives of Mary and Jesus. These episodes provide the focus of the meditation whilst the Our Fathers and Hail Marys are being recited. The final set of five (the Luminous Mysteries or, Mysteries of Light) were a later addition and focus on what Jesus did when he started ministering in public; his miracles and teachings.

HOW TO PRAY THE ROSARY



This bead ends the first decade. Here you pray the 'Glory Be to the Father' and the Fatima Prayer. This bead also is the start of the next decade. So after the Fatima Prayer, you announce the Second Mystery and pray the Our Father again before moving on and saying the next ten Hail Marys.

Here we pray ten Hail Marys. You can think about the words of the Hail Mary, the mystery and the people you are praying for.

Pray the Our Father as you think about the mystery of 'The Agony in the Garden'. You can add any prayer intentions you have.

Pray three Hail Marys whilst asking God to give you faith, hope and charity (one for each of the three beads).

Pray the Apostles' Creed and one Our Father.

This bead is for praying the 'Glory Be'. When we praise God, we realise that all we have depends on his goodness. It's a way to make us less self-centred.

Begin with the Sign of the Cross. Take a moment to do this prayerfully. Remember that God is listening to your prayers and that the Mother of God is offering what is in your heart to Jesus. When we make the Sign of the Cross, it's like saying to God, 'this time is yours'. We are very privileged to be able to speak to God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit whenever we want, so it's good to remind ourselves to whom we are speaking. Remember that Our Lady and the whole of heaven are praying with us too and cheering us on. Picture giving your 'intention' (the thing you are praying for) to God. You can pray for more than one thing.

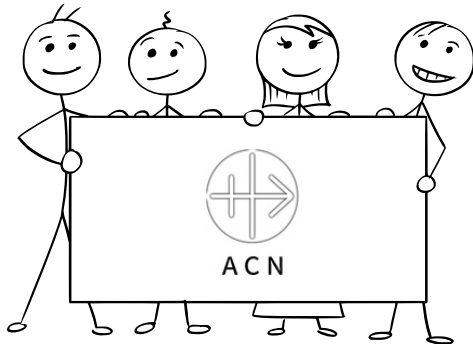

Letter from Aid to the Church in Need

One million children pray the Rosary 2024 - Rome, 21 June 2024

Dear friends of ACN,

For a number of years now, each year on October 18, ACN has been organising the prayer campaign "A Million Children Praying the Rosary". In 2023 for the first time, more than one million children actually registered on our homepage. In doing so they confirmed what Pope Benedict had already written, back in 2008: "The prayer of the Rosary is no mere pious exercise that belongs to the past, as though it were some prayer from other times that we look back on nostalgically. This is undoubtedly one of the most eloquent signs of the love that the younger generation are showing for Jesus and his Mother Mary. In today's world, where there is so much distraction, this prayer helps to place Christ in the centre, just as the Virgin Mary did when she treasured everything that was said about her Son, and everything that He did and said, in the depths of her heart."

It has so often been the experience of the Church, even in our modern times, that God grants special help and graces - especially graces of peace - through the intercession of Mary via the prayer of the Rosary. Consequently, ACN is very much committed to reviving and encouraging the devotion to the Rosary. We would love to recruit you too in regularly cultivating this prayer and working together with us to encourage the children to love and pray the Rosary.

Great blessings will undoubtedly flow from this - for yourselves, for your children and for our so sorely troubled world as well. "In order to be an apostle of the Rosary", Pope Benedict XVI said in Pompeii, "we need to personally experience the beauty and depth of this prayer - so simple and accessible to everyone. Above all we must allow the Virgin Mary to lead us by the hand in contemplating the face of Christ, a joyful, luminous, sorrowful and glorious face. Whoever, like Mary and together with her, embraces the Mysteries of Jesus and tirelessly contemplates them identifies more and more with what He thought and felt and becomes more and more like Him."

Sister Lucy of Fatima wrote: "In these last times in which we now live the most Blessed Virgin has given a new power and effectiveness to the Rosary. And so there is no single problem, however serious [...] that we cannot solve through the prayer of the Rosary. By means of the Rosary we will save and sanctify ourselves, console our Lord and gain the salvation of many souls."


And so we would like to encourage you to join us in two things:

We are close to you in prayer, confident of your generous response. May God bless you and all who are dear to you, and may the Blessed Virgin Mary protect you!



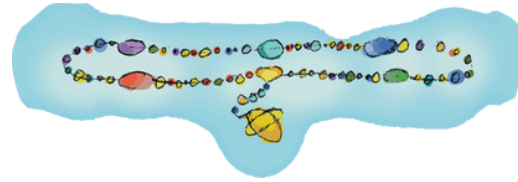

SESSION 4: BLESSING & PRAYER

Formation in Prayer:

The Sorrowful Mysteries.
Understanding how the rosary is used for personal and community prayer.

Blessing of rosary beads if a priest is available.

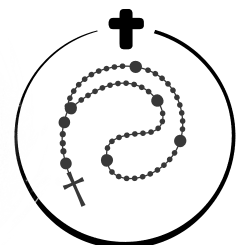
SESSION STRUCTURE

This session provides the opportunity for you to pray the rosary together as a group.

Watch Fr Frankie discuss the rosary and why having your rosary beads blessed is important SLIDE 3.

Pray some or all of the rosary together.

After the session write your thoughts and prayers into your journal.



THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES

These mysteries are about Jesus' suffering and death. We walk with him and those he loved through the events which led to his crucifixion. When we pray these mysteries, we can offer to God our own suffering, the pain of those we love and of the world. We can also consider the fact that he is with us in our darkest times and that he went to the cross because he wanted to 'take on' the consequences of sin - which is separation from God.

PLACING OURSELVES IN GOD'S PRESENCE

When we make the Sign of the Cross, it's good to remind ourselves that we are now entering a different space. We are using our will, our minds and our actions to place ourselves in the presence of God. Think about the meaning of the words, the message being presented and the fact that you are now actively communicating with God.

FIRST SORROWFUL MYSTERY



THE AGONY IN THE GARDEN

SOME THOUGHTS FOR MEDITATION:

Jesus knows he has been betrayed and that he has to die. His suffering is so intense that his sweat turns to blood. He is carrying the psychological and spiritual weight of all the sins, injustices, hatred and evil that have ever existed and ever will exist. He asks the disciples to stay awake with him but they keep falling asleep. He prays to the Father in desperation asking if there's another way (the 'cup' represents the way he will die), but he accepts the Father's will (unlike Adam - therefore redeeming the sin in the *other* garden; Eden).

PRAYER SUGGESTIONS TO GET STARTED:

Here we can pray for those who feel alone and abandoned by their friends and by God. We can imagine ourselves speaking to Jesus and staying with him (we can use our imagination to pray). We can offer our sadnesses, disappointments and fears to him and unite our pain to his.

THE SCOURGING AT THE PILLAR

BIBLE QUOTE: (JOHN 19:1 NRSVCE)

"Then Pilate took Jesus and scourged him."

SOME THOUGHTS FOR MEDITATION:

Scourging or flogging was a legal prelude to every Roman execution and was a brutal form of torture. "Pilate knew that Jesus was innocent and that he was delivered out of envy. He wanted to save Jesus but he didn't have the courage to go against the wishes of the crowd."* Do I ever lack the courage to do what is right? Jesus took away other people's wounds but now he is the one being wounded. Do I wound others or try to heal their wounds?

PRAYER SUGGESTIONS TO GET STARTED:

God, give me strength to be a blessing to others. Help those who are being hurt, abused and tortured in the world today. Bring peace to all hearts.

THIRD SORROWFUL MYSTERY



THE CROWNING WITH THORNS

BIBLE QUOTE: (JOHN 19:1-4)

"The soldiers plaited a crown of thorns, and put it on his head, and arrayed him in a purple robe; they came up to him, saying, 'Hail, King of the Jews!' and struck him with their hands."

SOME THOUGHTS FOR MEDITATION:

In this mystery we see Jesus suffering humiliation as the soldiers mock him. God who had created the universe was allowing himself to be tormented. He gave up everything to bridge the gap caused by sin and took on the consequences of all our failings. Am I willing to take this seriously, to think about eternal life and what is being offered to me by a God whose love knows no limits?

PRAYER SUGGESTIONS TO GET STARTED:

We can pray for those who suffer mentally, those who feel humiliated and alone. We can offer to God the times we feel shame.

FORTH SORROWFUL MYSTERY



THE CARRYING OF THE CROSS

BIBLE QUOTE: (MATTHEW 26:39 NRSVCE)

"My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will."

SOME THOUGHTS FOR MEDITATION

"It was not lawful to condemn a Roman citizen to death by crucifixion: it was too humiliating. The moment that Jesus ...took up the Cross in order to carry it to Calvary marked a turning-point in the history of the cross. The symbol of a shameful death, reserved for the lowest classes, the cross becomes a key. From now on, with the help of this key, man will open the door of the deepest mystery of God." (St Pope John Paul II).

PRAYER SUGGESTIONS TO GET STARTED:

Here we can pray for people who are facing traumatic situations and have large problems in life to bear. People we know, situations in the news or things in our own families.

FIFTH SORROWFUL MYSTERY



THE CRUCIFIXION

BIBLE QUOTE: (MARK 15:34-35 NIV)

"At noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?' (which means 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?')."

SOME THOUGHTS FOR MEDITATION:

Think about Jesus on the cross. Imagine yourself there with Mary and the disciple John. Let the Holy Spirit guide you.

PRAYER SUGGESTIONS TO GET STARTED:

People who are fighting wars now - that there will be a change of heart from leaders and politicians. That the injustices which lead to war will cease.

We can also think about those we have lost and offer them to Our Lord and those who are sick and suffering.

PRAYER GUIDANCE

These prayers are all part of the rosary. The Apostles' Creed is prayed on the first bead at the start of the rosary. This is a proclamation of what we believe.

The Fatima Prayer was given by Our Lady to the children when she appeared to them. This is a prayer for all of the human race to ask God to save everyone.

The Hail Holy Queen (or "Salve Regina" in Latin) is prayed every day by the whole Church. It is an anthem to Our Lady which has been in use since the 11th century. You can hear it being sung in Latin here: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=f0YWKLNhTvE>

These prayers may well be too advanced for the children you will be leading the rosary with. Please discuss with the teacher in charge. The guidance in the Prayer and Liturgy Directory for schools (*To love You more dearly*) states that The Apostles' Creed is suitable for ages 7-9 upwards and the Hail Holy Queen for ages 11-14.

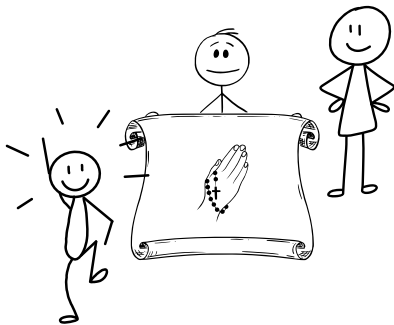


SESSION 5: ORGANISATION

You will know by now whether you are visiting the school or parish group once or twice. Either way, you should have a presentation prepared and have worked out how you will lead them in praying the rosary.

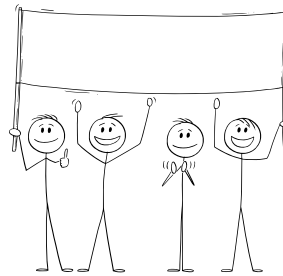
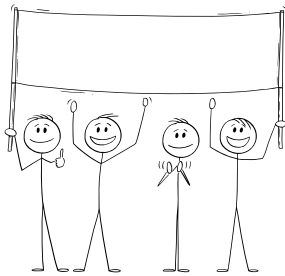

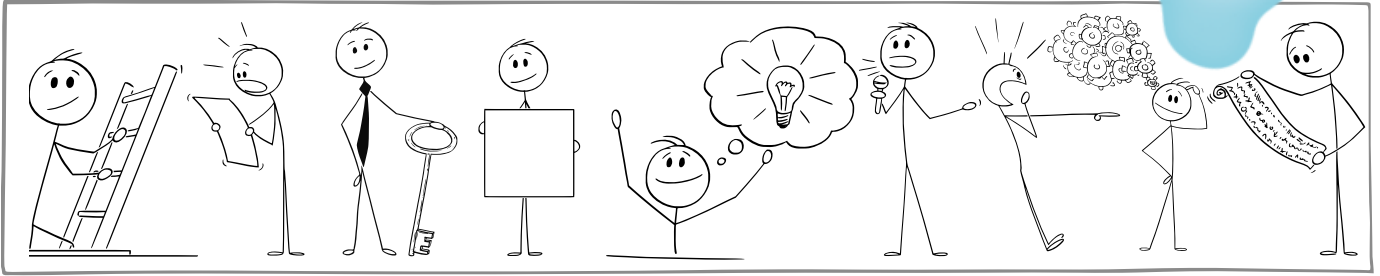

PUBLIC SPEAKING

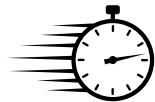
When we imagine ourselves speaking in public, we often feel daunted. The distance between where we are and where we want to be as a speaker or presenter can seem vast and the ladder between, steep. Many of us look at others who seem to have natural confidence and compare ourselves negatively. The truth is that speaking in public is a skill which can be learned. You speak all the time in everyday life and therefore already have and use effectively the skills you need: arranging information, varying pitch, reading the reactions, telling stories, conveying emotion, showing empathy and getting your message across. Below you will find some tips and exercises to help you further develop your skills. When you are well prepared you can be more relaxed and able to let your personality shine through. This is the intention of these exercises and tips.

TASK

Using the information below, prepare a two-minute speech/presentation about the rosary for the age-group you will be presenting to. When you have written it, look at the 'Helpful Tips' on page 23 and complete the exercises. Rehearse your speech in front of the group.

WORK OUT TIMING

TIME



How long have you got? The average speaking rate is about 125-200 words a minute (presentations around 140 wpm). There are lots of apps available online which allow you to work out your own speaking pace. From there, ascertain how many words your presentation should contain and stick to it.

PRACTISE

Practise in front of friends, the mirror, video yourself and practise again. This is hard to do, but it is by far the best way of becoming a proficient public speaker.

ADD INTEREST

Use stories, statistics (sparingly), short quotes, humour, examples, news, cultural or age-related references to add interest and to keep engagement high.

THREE POINTS

A good rule of thumb is to have three main points. This is easy for you and the listeners. Make sure each point directly references your one-sentence summary.

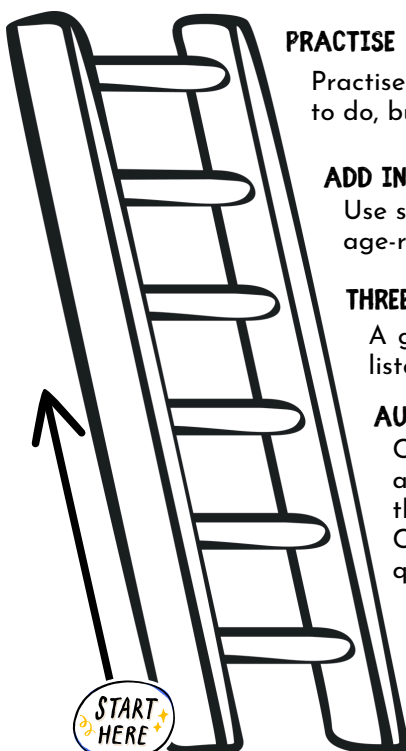
AUDIENCE & CONTENT

Consider your audience: What are their expectations, interests and attention span and how can you adapt your content or the way you say it to reflect this? Are there issues you need to be aware of?

Consider your content: Have they heard this before or is it all new? What questions might they want to ask?

SUMMARISE YOUR WHOLE PRESENTATION / TALK IN ONE SENTENCE

Work out the aim of your talk. What do you want the audience to go away with?









PUBLIC SPEAKING



HELPFUL TIPS

THE ACN ONE MILLION CHILDREN PRAYING THE ROSARY FOR PEACE

Choose one or two of the tips below that you would like to work on. You are not expected to incorporate all of these! Are there any you didn't know? Which is the most useful?

1 Be yourself. This sounds like a cliché, but it is the key. Do not think you have to be 'more' extrovert/comedic/interesting or any other label.	2 Find an interesting fact. Something your audience doesn't know and will want to share.	3 If the audience starts getting restless, ask them to stand up. Have a game that involves movement ready. This will encourage oxygen to the brain. 
4 Consider your beginning and ending. It elevates your whole presentation if you get these right and they are memorable. 	5 If you use slides, never read bullet points from them. This sends most people to sleep! Know your material rather than relying on the slides.	6 If someone looks bored, anxious or hostile, try to ignore it. You have no idea what's happening in their heads and it's probably nothing to do with you.
7 Imagine your voice is rising above the audience and hitting the back of the room in an arc. This helps you project your voice.	8 Check technology before. Back-up presentations and check again - especially if you are in a new environment. 	9 Chat with the group before you start and try to find out a name or two. Refer back to them in your talk. This shows interest and warmth.
10 Own the space. Stand tall with your weight balanced equally. Try not to fiddle with your hair, lanyard, hands or notes.	11 Remember that the audience are not judges who are about to jump on any mistake. They are likely to be on your side.	12 Focus on the ideas you are communicating, not how you will be perceived. This helps with nerves. 
13 Some nerves are good - they give you the adrenaline and therefore energy you need. Professional speakers try to turn their nerves into excitement. 	14 Act: put acting skills to good use. Even if you feel out of your depth, act like a person who feels completely in control. It works!	15 Smile - this goes a long way!
16 If it goes wrong it is not the end of the world! Often people won't notice and even if they do, they will understand as they have probably been there themselves.	17 Let your passion for your topic show. 	18 Don't rush; use silence and vary the tone of your voice if you can. Use stories, as people always remember them.

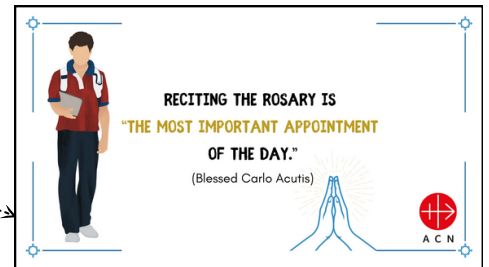

CERTIFICATES

Certificates will be countersigned by Bishop Oliver Doeme Dashe. Bishop Oliver (diocese of Maiduguri, Nigeria), a project partner and friend of ACN. The following excerpt is adapted from the book "10 Wonders of the Rosary" by Fr. Donald Calloway, MIC.

In December 2014, Jesus appeared to a Bishop Oliver and instructed him that the rosary was the weapon that would overcome Boko Haram. Bishop Oliver claims that one evening, while he was praying his rosary, Jesus appeared to him holding a sword. During the vision, Jesus extended the sword toward the bishop. When the bishop went to take the sword from Jesus, it miraculously transformed into a rosary! Once the bishop had the rosary-sword in his hands, Jesus looked at him and said three times, "Boko Haram is gone! Boko Haram is gone! Boko Haram is gone!"

After the bishop of Maiduguri had his vision, he began to promote the rosary in his diocese in Nigeria. In many of his interviews, he repeats his vision and informs his listeners of his interpretation of the vision in the following words: "As soon as I received the sword, it turned into a rosary. I didn't need any prophet to give me the explanation. It was clear that with the rosary we would be able to expel Boko Haram." On October 13, 2016, dozens of kidnapped girls were suddenly released by Boko Haram from captivity. In May 2017, another 83 girls were released. Then, on July 3, 2017, 700 members of Boko Haram surrendered their weapons and turned themselves in to Nigerian authorities.
