
Stations of the Cross for the Suffering Church

Introduction:

THE WAY OF THE CROSS


Every day millions of Christians around the world suffer for their Faith. Many are persecuted for their beliefs; their ordeals can include discrimination at home or in the workplace, fines, imprisonment, torture and even execution. Still others are living out their Christian Faith in extremely isolated communities or in the face of abject poverty.

Every story about suffering and persecuted Christians involves real people with names and hopes and dreams. It is often far too easy for us to think in terms of facts, figures and statistics rather than those who are suffering. St Paul the Apostle reminds us that, "just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptised into one body... If one member suffers, all suffer together; if one member is honoured, all rejoice together." (1 cor 12: 12-13, 26 RSV-CE) St Paul underlines our responsibility towards our brothers and sisters. So let us work together to end their suffering and persecution by offering our prayers, sharing their stories with others and, finally, through our actions.



Just as we walk with Jesus whenever we pray before the Stations of the Cross, so we walk with all those who suffer for their faith. Let us pray for them, that their faith may continue to grow and that their suffering will ease through the mercy and compassion of Our Lord.

JESUS IS CONDEMNED TO DEATH

Myanmar (Burma)

Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) offices in 23 countries led hour-long prayer vigils on Saturday, 1st February, and asked the charity's friends and benefactors around the world to pray with them.

The Burmese military has not been able to consolidate power since overthrowing the democratically elected members of the government on 1st February 2021, leading to ongoing violence and crackdowns against civilians opposing the new regime.

Millions of people fled their homes as a result of the crisis. There are more than 2.8 million IDPs (internally displaced persons) in Myanmar (Burma), according to UN reports.

Regina Lynch, ACN (International) Executive President, said: "We at [ACN] are deeply moved by the situation in Myanmar.

"This day [was] an opportunity for everyone, regardless of their place of origin, to unite in a collective plea for peace and reconciliation." ACN News January 30 2025

Mozambique

In Mozambique, since October 2017 about 5,000 people have been killed and one million displaced, as a result of the violent clashes between insurgents seeking to establish an Islamic state and the Mozambique Defence Armed Forces according to reports received by Aid to the Church in Need (ACN). The fighting has been concentrated around Muslim-majority Cabo Delgado Province in northern Mozambique

Bishop António Juliasse of Pemba, located in the port-city of Pemba the capital of the province of Cabo Delgado, told ACN that people in his diocese have faced "seven years of displacement; seven years of death; seven years during which people have lived with great suffering; of hunger, because they cannot farm their land due to insecurity; of disease, because there is no access to medication, or because the closest clinic has been destroyed. Seven years during which children have not been able to study as they should.

Extremist groups have tended to target civilian and state-owned institutions, but attacks focused on Christian communities have also been reported. The bishop said: "The Church continues to do what is in its nature, to be with the people, to help those we can help, and to offer what aid we receive. ACN [...] always come to our assistance at the most critical times. ACN News October 21 2024

Syria

Despite Syria's Christian schools reopening concerns remain about the future of Christianity in the country. An ACN contact said: "My message to the world is the importance of international support for Christians to establish a civil constitution, rather than an Islamic Shari'a-based constitution. The source added that the Christian population in Syria is so small that they do not have enough power to make them "capable of securing their rights in terms of the constitution, institutional life and civil governance.

The source added that authorities have assured the public that Christian schools would be able to operate as normal. During 13 years of conflict, in which Syria suffered a crippling financial crisis. trust in the authorities has been deeply shaken.

ACN is committed to providing continued support, including emergency aid, medical assistance and food supplies for Christian families, as well as helping with pastoral activities, the rebuilding of homes and the installation of solar panels on Church buildings and schools to reduce energy costs. 

Nigeria

Sister Vincentia María Nwankwo and Sister Grace Mariette Okoli, were abducted on 7th January 2025 in Anambra State, south-east Nigeria. Both religious Sisters belong to Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, Mother of Christ.

According to the congregation's secretary-general Sister Maria Sobenna Ikeotuonye, Sister Vincentia María, the principal of Archbishop Charles Heerey Memorial Model Secondary School, Ufuma, and Sister Grace Mariette, a teacher at Immaculata Girls Model Secondary School, Nnewi, were seized on the Ufuma road after attending a meeting in Ogboji, a town in the Aguata Local Government Area. Although not officially confirmed, it is believed that the abductors are local armed criminals, commonly known as kidnapping gangs.

Sister Ikeotuonye said: "We solicit your fervent prayers and supplications to God that they may be released as soon as possible and come back to us safe and sound. Pray also that they may be released unconditionally."

In 2024, according to research by ACN, 11 priests were abducted in the country and another priest was killed. ACN News January 9 2025



Ukraine

After more than a thousand days of fighting in Ukraine, Father Lucas Perozzi, a Brazilian missionary priest ministering in Kyiv, told ACN that "psychologically, people are tired, very scared and without hope." Father Perozzi said that his "mission... to spread the Gospel... isn't easy. People need hope, they need God, the sacred", but it seems that "nothing consoles them anymore. They have given up searching. They have become apathetic, disillusioned."

Father Lucas, who has remained in Kyiv to minister to the faithful rather than return to his native Brazil, explained to ACN "We go to sleep to the sound of sirens, and we wake up to the sound of sirens and bombings. He continued: "You can't live like this. For the first six months we used to run to the bunkers, but not anymore. When our time comes, it will come. Only God knows the hour. It could be a missile or a heart attack."

He added that the Church in Ukraine has received much-needed support from ACN, including "help to hold summer camps for children, which is very important, because they are living in a state of constant alarm...



Lebanon

Marielle Boutros, Lebanon project coordinator at Catholic charity Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) said there are 1.5 million displaced people - one in four people in Lebanon - mostly concentrated in the Mount Lebanon region, who were forced to leave their homes in southern Lebanon because of Israel's bombing of Hezbollah targets.

She added that the Church has been quick to respond to the crisis, with many of those displaced fleeing to Christian areas where they were welcomed in shelters such as schools, churches, retreat centres or private houses. ACN has provided emergency aid – including food and medicine – to support the relief efforts in Lebanon where about one third of the population is Christian.

Ms Boutros said that the Church had already worked hard to provide support to those in need before the war broke out as the country has been going through a crippling economic crisis for a number of years.



Cameroon

In the 2024 Global Terrorism Index report by the Institute for Economics and Peace, Cameroon was ranked as the sixth country in Africa and 12th in the world worst affected by terrorism.

Bishop Bruno Ateba of Maroua-Mokolo told ACN the two parishes of his diocese which border Nigeria are the most impacted by the violence. Bishop Ateba said the "sporadic attacks" by Jihadist terrorist group Boko Haram in northern Cameroon were mainly to "steal food, livestock, money and even clothes", but they no longer have "heavy weapons". He told ACN that weapons will not "solve the problem of Boko Haram". "If young people have prospects, it will be difficult for Boko Haram to recruit new members and brainwash them." "Most of the time, the army is there to protect the population, but the partisans of Boko Haram in Cameroon tell Boko Haram in Nigeria when the soldiers are not there." He explained: "The people are afraid."

Bishop Ateba concluded: "It's not easy here, especially because of climatic conditions, poverty and terrorism, but ACN helps us enormously." ACN News January 10 2025





Holy Land

In April Cardinal Pizzaballa told ACN that, after the war, it will be possible to "rebuild the infrastructure – but how can we rebuild relationships?" The patriarch said "What concerns me is the level of hatred. The hate speech, the language of contempt, the denial of the other is very problematic." He added that the Christian community "because we are so small [1.5 percent of the population] and politically irrelevant, we have the freedom to connect with everyone.

Almost all the Christians in the West Bank who worked in Israel have had their permits revoked since the beginning of the conflict, and those who worked in the tourism sector have lost their livelihoods due to the cancellation of pilgrimages. Since October 2023, ACN's help in the Holy Land has included: emergency and subsistence aid, job creation programmes, transportation, support for church construction and pastoral projects and help with the formation of priests and religious.

Cardinal Pizzaballa said it is essential for Christians to remain in the region to "keep the memory of Jesus alive in the land of Jesus". ACN News December 11 2024

Haiti

Haiti – which is the poorest country in the western hemisphere – has been going through a deep political, social and economic crisis for years, with armed gangs having taken control of the capital. Since March 2024, Haiti has been paralysed by violence however since early November Archbishop Max Leroys Mésidor of Port-au-Prince, President of the Haitian Bishops' Conference, told ACN the ongoing fighting "has taken a serious turn".

Criminals have cut off the main transport routes between Port-au-Prince and the rest of the country, destroying livelihoods and depriving the population of basic services. Within a period of four days in November, more than 20,000 people in the Port-au-Prince region fled their homes according to reports from the United Nations. UNICEF estimates that more than 700,000 people – about half of them children – have been displaced within the country. In 2024, ACN supported the Church in Haiti with up to 70 projects, such as training and subsistence aid for priests, religious and catechists, as well as funding for diocesan radio stations and solar panels for Church buildings. Mali

In Mali, Christians make up 2.35 percent of Mali's 20 million population, according to ACN's Religious Freedom in the World Report 2023.

Islamist militant groups have seized large swathes of the country where they have imposed the jizya Islamic tax of 25,000 CFA francs (£32) on those over 18 years of age in the Christian village Douna-Pen in Mopti Region. Some only earn 50,000 CFA francs (£64) a month in what is one of the world's poorest countries. A source told ACN that those unable or unwilling to pay have been threatened with the closure of their churches. The source added: "We know that the country is large and that the same is happening in other places, but if we don't do something in this area soon, the consequences will be disastrous.

The ACN contact explained that this latest case of financial extortion is just one example of the persecution afflicting Christians in the region, and physical attacks are also common – adding that problems are made worse by a lack of basic infrastructure, such as roads and water supply systems, and schools closing due to growing insecurity. This latest massacre testifies to a cruelty in a stronger determination than ever to sow terror in Burkina Faso where more half of the country is now controlled by terrorists.

Burkina Faso

In a series of attacks over 3 consecutive days in October 2024, Islamist extremists massacred at least 150 people in the town of Manni – home to a large Catholic community – in eastern Burkina Faso. Local sources told ACN the extremists opened fire at residents and torched buildings before returning the following day, attacking medical staff and murdering many of the previously injured who were being treated in hospital. In the third and final attack, the extremist killed all the men they could find in the town.

For a number of years Burkina Faso has endured the highest level of extremist violence in the Sahel region. More than two million people – about 10 percent of the population – have been displaced as a result

In response to the escalating violence, ACN has stepped up its emergency aid to Burkina Faso, providing food, medicine and psychological help for traumatised people. ACN News October 17 2024



Pakistan

Two days after a violent mob brutally beat Mr Nazir Gill Masih, a Christian shoe factory owner from Sargodha, Punjab Province, and his son Pakistan's police have charged more than 100 men for the attempted lynching of Mr Masih and his son; they have also launched an investigation into allegations of blasphemy against Mr Masih. Extremists attacked Mr Masih and his son on Saturday 25th May, blaming them for burning the Qur'an after damaged pages of the Islamic holy book were found outside their house in Sargodha. The mob also looted and set fire to Mr Masih's home and factory. Mr Masih, who was in his 70s, died from his injuries on 3rd June.

Speaking to ACN, Archbishop Joseph Arshad of Islamabad-Rawalpindi – who visited Sargodha on the day of the attack – called on Pakistan's government to help prevent further violent incidents and to ensure the security of the country's Christian community. ACN News May 28 2024



Democratic Republic of Congo

Bishop Melchisedec Sikuli Paluku of Butembo-Beni in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) has called on authorities to "put an end to the plight of the Congolese people" following the massacre of around 150 people – including at least 80 Christians – by the Allied Democratic Forces (ADF) which is affiliated with Daesh (ISIS).

The terrorist group carried out the killings in villages in North Kivu Province in the eastern part of the (DRC) between 4th and 8th June. They torched homes, medical facilities, businesses and vehicles, forcing survivors to flee the area. Eastern DRC – a region rich in natural resources – has been plagued by violent incursions by rebel groups since the 1990s.

Bishop Paluku wrote that "with the mobilisation of all Congolese, good will triumph over evil, life will conquer death and the truth will ultimately destroy lies". The Holy Father, Pope Francis also condemned the massacres and said that among the victims were "Christians killed "in odium fidei" – in hatred of the faith – who are therefore "martyrs", whose "sacrifice is a seed that germinates and bears fruit, teaching us to bear witness to the Gospel with courage and consistency". Bangladesh

In Bangladesh a well-placed ACN source said that religious freedom – despite being guaranteed by the constitution – is not being respected, and "the fundamentalist Jamaat-e-Islami party wants Islam to be the only religion in Bangladesh". Consequently, the future of Catholic schools is under threat, Church construction projects are delayed, and Christians struggle to find work.

Catholic schools and universities have been targeted by mobs "controlled by Jamaat-e-Islami", an Islamist political party with ties to the government. A mob of Islamist extremists has set fire to a Catholic school and completely burnt down some of the classrooms, and others have been putting increasing pressure on Catholic institutions to replace the people in charge. In a number of schools "religious administrators have been forced to resign" – adding that "in one [Catholic] school, two Sisters have been forced to step down. ACN's contact highlighted that the Church has set up an interfaith committee of legal experts and other leaders who have been instrumental in helping Christian communities "maintain a peaceful situation" and "appeal for justice."

ACN's help in Bangladesh includes church and school construction projects, training programmes for catechists and Mass stipends for priests. <u>ACN News November 11 2024</u>



Iraq

The Daughters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a Chaldean order of religious Sisters, has been able to go back to the village of Araden in northern Iraq.

Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) helped the order to return to its birthplace by supporting the building of a retreat centre and a shrine to the order's founder, Father Abdul Ahad Rayes. Mother Superior Samar Mikha said: "The revitalised space will continue the mission of Father Rayes by supporting the Christian educational needs of the region."

The village has been a hub of Aramaic-speaking Christian activity, and its three churches Mart Shmoni, Sultana Mahdokht and Mar Awda were all founded more than a millennium ago. But a succession of conflicts from the First Iraqi-Kurdish War in the 1960s down to bombing raids by Turkish air force at the end of the last decade have seen numbers decline as villagers fled the danger.

Mother Samar thanked ACN for helping the community re-establish itself in Araden. "The Abdul-Ahad shrine and retreat house now stands as a symbol of resilience and hope for our community." ACN News September 12 2024
